# The Time of Christmas and Easter

## Daily Readings: 2025-2026 Year Two – Proper

Our Lord desires that his children, his Church, be drawn together in the unity of truth and in the bonds of affection. Learning to read and speak God's truth together in the same ways is one path to this. *Taking Gathered Worship Home* (TGWH) has been developed for you to use in the private worship of your home, whether you are married or single, and whether or not you have children. It is a tool to knit us together throughout the church year. While we would encourage the use of the weekly prayer and daily lectionary in its entirety, you are certainly free to adapt these materials to your particular circumstances and personal/family worship time.

The first component listed for each week is a written **prayer** for your use during that particular week. It generally follows the theme set by the scripture readings used in the Divine Service on that Sunday. These prayers are taken from *The Lutheran Service Book*, Year A (2007).

The second component of TGWH is the week's suggested **Bible reading**. The readings are adapted from the *Book of Common Prayer* and the *Book of Common Worship*. They are arranged in a two-year cycle and provide for reading twice through the New Testament and once through much of the Old Testament. The readings reflect the seasons and festivals of the Christian year and come from the Psalter, the Old Testament, the Pastoral Epistles, and the Gospels. Often the readings will be connected thematically, giving us a wonderful way to receive the "whole counsel of God."

The third component is the questions and answers from the **Heidelberg Catechism** which has been divided into 52 weeks, starting in Advent (December) and concluding at the end of the Church Year (November).

It takes a great deal of planning, discipline, and commitment to form this habit of daily reading and praying, but it is one of inestimable value in our "conforming to the likeness of Christ." May God use these elements in our private worship to draw us together in unity and affection, for his glory and the building up of his Church.

### Q.1. What is thy only comfort in life and death?

**A.** That I with body and soul, both in life and death, (a) am not my own, (b) but belong unto my faithful Savior Jesus Christ; (c) who, with his precious blood, has fully satisfied for all my sins, (d) and delivered me from all the power of the devil; (e) and so preserves me (f) that without the will of my heavenly Father, not a hair can fall from my head; (g) yea, that all things must be subservient to my salvation, (h) and therefore, by his Holy Spirit, he also assures me of eternal life, (i) and makes me sincerely willing and ready, henceforth, to live unto him. (j)

## Heidelberg Catechism

### Q. 4. What does the law of God require of us?

**A.** Christ teaches us that briefly, Matt. 22:37-40, “Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength. This is the first and the great commandment; and the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the proph-ets.”(a)

### Q. 5. Canst thou keep all these things perfectly?

**A.** In no wise; (a) for I am prone by nature to hate God and my neighbor. (b)

### Q. 6. Did God then create man so wicked and per-verse?

**A.** By no means; but God created man good, (a) and after his own image, (b) in true righteousness and holiness, that he might rightly know God his Crea-tor, heartily love him and live with him in eternal happiness to glorify and praise him. (c)

Amen.*

### Heidelberg Catechism

#### **Q. 7. Whence then proceeds this depravity of human nature?**

**A.** From the fall and disobedience of our first parents, Adam and Eve, in Paradise; (a) hence our nature is become so corrupt, that we are all conceived and born in sin. (b)

#### **Q. 8. Are we then so corrupt that we are wholly incapable of doing any good, and inclined to all wickedness?**

**A.** Indeed we are; (a) except we are regenerated by the Spirit of God. (b)

## Heidelberg Catechism

### Q. 10. Will God suffer such disobedience and rebellion to go unpunished?

**A.** By no means; but is terribly displeased (a) with our original as well as actual sins; and will punish them in his just judgment temporally and eternally, (b) as he has declared, “Cursed is every one that continueth not in all things, which are written in the book of the law, to do them.” (c)

**A.** God is indeed merciful, (a) but also just; (b) therefore his justice requires, that sin which is committed against the most high majesty of God, be also punished with extreme, that is, with everlasting punishment of body and soul.

### Q. 12. Since then, by the righteous judgment of God, we deserve temporal and eternal punishment, is there no way by which we may escape that punishment, and be again received into favor?

**A.** God will have his justice satisfied: (a) and therefore we must make this full satisfaction, either by ourselves, or by another. (b)

**Q. 13. Can we ourselves then make this satisfaction?**

**A.** By no means; but on the contrary we daily increase our debt. (a)

**Q. 14. Can there be found anywhere, one, who is a mere creature, able to satisfy for us?**

**A.** None; for, first, God will not punish any other creature for the sin which man has committed; (a) and further, no mere creature can sustain the burden of God's eternal wrath against sin, so as to deliver others from it. (b)

**A.** Because the justice of God requires that the same hu-man nature which has sinned, should likewise make satis-faction for sin; (a) and one, who is himself a sinner, cannot satisfy for others. (b)

**A.** From the holy gospel, which God himself first revealed in Paradise; (a) and afterwards published by the patriarchs (b) and prophets, (c) and represented by the sacrifices and other ceremonies of the law; (d) and lastly, has fulfilled it by his only begotten Son. (e)

**A.** Two: namely, holy baptism, and the holy supper.

**Q. 69. How does holy baptism signify and seal to you that the one sacrifice of Christ on the cross benefits you?**

**A.** In this way: Christ instituted this outward washing (a) and with it gave the promise that, as surely as water washes away the dirt from the body, so certainly his blood and Spirit wash away the impurity of my soul, that is, all my sins. (b)

## Heidelberg Catechism

### Q. 70. What does it mean to be washed with Christ's blood and Spirit?

**A.** To be washed with Christ's blood means to receive forgiveness of sins from God, through grace, because of Christ's blood, poured out for us in sacrifice on the cross.[1] To be washed with his Spirit means to be renewed by the Holy Spirit and sanctified to be members of Christ, so that more and more we become dead to sin and lead a holy and blameless life.[2]

### Q. 71. Where has Christ promised that he will wash us with his blood and Spirit as surely as we are washed with the water of baptism?

**A.** In the institution of baptism, where he says: Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.[1] He who believes and is baptized will be saved, but he who does not believe will be condemned.[2] This promise is repeated where Scripture calls baptism the washing of regeneration and the washing away of sins.[3]

### Q. 72. Does this outward washing with water itself wash away sins?

**A.** No, only the blood of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit cleanse us from all sins.[1]

## Seventh Week of Easter – May 17, 2026

*O King of glory, Lord of hosts, uplifted in triumph far above all heavens, we pray, leave us not without consolation, but send us the Spirit of truth, whom you promised from the Father; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.*

### Heidelberg Catechism

#### **Q. 73. Why then does the Holy Spirit call baptism the washing of regeneration and the washing away of sins?**

**A.** God speaks in this way for a good reason. He wants to teach us that the blood and Spirit of Christ remove our sins just as water takes away dirt from the body.[1] But, even more important, he wants to assure us by this divine pledge and sign that we are as truly cleansed from our sins spiritually as we are bodily washed with water.[2]

#### **Q. 74. Should infants, too, be baptized?**

**A.** Yes. Infants as well as adults belong to God's covenant and congregation.[1] Through Christ's blood the redemption from sin and the Holy Spirit, who works faith, are promised to them no less than to adults.[2] Therefore, by baptism, as sign of the covenant, they must be grafted into the Christian church and distinguished from the children of unbelievers.[3] This was done in the old covenant by circumcision,[4] in place of which baptism was instituted in the new covenant.[5]

#### **Q. 75. How does the Lord's Supper signify and seal to you that you share in Christ's one sacrifice on the cross and in all his gifts?**

**A.** In this way: Christ has commanded me and all believers to eat of this broken bread and drink of this cup in remembrance of him. With this command he gave these promises:[1] First, as surely as I see with my eyes the bread of the Lord broken for me and the cup given to me, so surely was his body offered for me and his blood poured out for me on the cross. Second, as surely as I receive from the hand of the minister and taste with my mouth the bread and the cup of the Lord as sure signs of Christ's body and blood, so surely does he himself nourish and refresh my soul to everlasting life with his crucified body and shed blood

## Heidelberg Catechism

### Q. 76. What does it mean to eat the crucified body of Christ and to drink his shed blood?

**A.** First, to accept with a believing heart all the suffering and the death of Christ, and so receive forgiveness of sins and life eternal.[1] Second, to be united more and more to his sacred body through the Holy Spirit, who lives both in Christ and in us.[2] Therefore, although Christ is in heaven[3] and we are on earth, yet we are flesh of his flesh and bone of his bones,[4] and we forever live and are gov-erned by one Spirit, as the members of our body are by one soul.[5]

### 77. Q. Where has Christ promised that he will nourish and refresh believers with his body and blood as surely as they eat of this broken bread and drink of this cup?

**A.** In the institution of the Lord's supper: The Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.[1] This promise is re-peated by Paul where he says: The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not a par-ticipation in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread.[2]

### Q. 78. Are then the bread and wine changed into the real body and blood of Christ?

**A.** No. Just as the water of baptism is not changed into the blood of Christ and is not the washing away of sins itself but is simply God's sign and pledge,[1] so also the bread in the Lord's supper does not become the body of Christ itself,[2] although it is called Christ's body[3] in keeping with the nature and usage of sacraments.[4]
