Westminster Shorter Catechism

Q. 17. Into what state did the fall bring mankind?

A. The fall brought mankind into a state of sin and misery.^[a]

Q. 18. What is the sinfulness of that state into which man fell?

A. The sinfulness of the state into which man fell includes the guilt of Adam's first sin,^[a] the lack of the righteousness^[b] which he had at first, and the corruption of every part of his nature,^[c] which is commonly called Original Sin; together with all actual sins which flow from it.^[d]
