## Heidelberg Catechism

### Q. 29. Why is the Son of God called Jesus, that is, Savior?

A. Because he saves us from all our sins,<sup>[1]</sup> and because salvation is not to be sought or found in anyone else.<sup>[2]</sup>

### Q. 30. Do those believe in the only Savior Jesus who seek their salvation and well-being from saints, in themselves, or anywhere else?

A. No. Though they boast of him in words, they in fact deny the only Savior Jesus.<sup>[1]</sup>

For one of two things must be true: either Jesus is not a complete Savior, or those who by true faith accept this Savior must find in him all that is necessary for their salvation.<sup>[2]</sup>
