
People: Lord, hear our prayer.

### Psalm 91:1-16

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High,

SOR was the highlight of my education at Regents. I always looked forward to rhetoric classes with Mrs. Gore, as the thought-provoking topics we discussed encompassed my interests in politics and world events. Fast forward to my two tours in Afghanistan with the United States Army as a Second Lieutenant and First Lieutenant. As a young officer, I found myself recommending future courses of action to Lieutenant Colonels, Colonels, and sometimes Generals based on the collective research and analysis of a small group of nerds with guns. I realized that my credibility and success depended on my ability to deliver intelligent, cohesive, and comprehensible arguments.

### **Emily Rebecca Morrison**

Our precious daughter and constant joy in our lives, Emily Rebecca Morrison, was escorted by flights of angels into the presence of our Lord on March  $12^{th}$ , 2021.

Born August 7<sup>th</sup>, 1990, in Bellevue, Washington, to parents Mark and Nicole Morrison, Emily lived the equivalent of three lifetimes during her short 30 years with us. Besides her parents, she leaves behind three siblings; Nicholas Morrison with wife Sara and son Cormac (nephew), Lance Morrison, and Veronica Morrison along with Grandfather Richard Morrison, Aunts, Uncles, and cousins.

Beyond family, Emily's paramount passions were academic excellence, world-wide adventure, foreign languages, the culinary arts, her seven years of military service with specialization in military intelligence and counterinsurgency with the U.S. Army, flowers, photography, and bunnies.

Emily's childhood included family relocations from Seattle, to Colorado, Boston, California, and finally to Texas. Her passion for academics started as early as Kindergarten, culminating with her high school years at Regents School of Austin, and the University of Virginia.

Her interest in non-Western world cultures began in 5<sup>th</sup> grade while at Lexington Christian Academy in Boston, through a teacher whose brother was a freelance photographer for National Geographic. He would send his sister's class photographs of his travels to exotic locations throughout the world, and it was this experience that sparked Emily's interest in the Arabic language. Fast forward to her Sophomore year at Regents in Austin, Texas, where she was accepted to a program at the University of Texas which allowed her to parallel her Junior and Senior years of high school while simultaneously enrolled in Arabic language classes at the University. While still a high school student, Emily was also accepted into a short-term Study Abroad Program at the American University of Cairo, Egypt. Later, again at the American University in Cairo through a U.S. State Department scholarship following her collegiate Freshman year.

Upon high school graduation, she was accepted to a one-year Gap Program as an intern at King's Academy, outside of Amman, Jordan...a boarding school founded by King Abdullah whose purpose is to replicate a Western Liberal Arts education for Middle Eastern secondary students. At King's, Emily was a Dorm Mother to 9th grade girls, taught photography, coached the girls' swim team, and due to her written and literary skills, selected by the school administration to draft grant requests to world-wide donors. She took advantage of this time to travel extensively throughout Jordan, Syria, Lebanon, and Israel.

Upon return to the United States, she enrolled at the University of Virginia under a full four-year U.S. Army ROTC scholarship to study Middle Eastern languages and literature. It was here that she developed a love for the Persian language and literature. In parallel to ROTC, Emily self-funded her room and board with all expenses as a Resident Advisor at Brown College on the UVA campus along with part-time work at a local café. Her UVA studies included a six -month study abroad program in Tajikistan....earning a Fulbright Scholarship, chartered to create a thesis on "Creation of a National Identity within a post-Soviet Society".

Graduation from UVA also meant her commission as a  $2^{nd}$  lieutenant with the U.S. Army. At the outset, Emily volunteered for an extra three years active duty to be added to her four-year post-graduation military obligation. Emily was so excited and extremely proud to serve two separate combat deployments in Afghanistan as a military intelligence officer. She returned with a Bronze Star and promotion to Captain.

Emily's life-long goal was to pursue higher graduate level academic achievement at a noteworthy graduate school. She was accepted to Harvard's Davis Center for Eurasian Studies Master's Program three weeks before her death, scheduled to begin classes this coming fall.

Emily was a fighter, an overcomer, very loyal to her friends, living life to its fullest in a very positive and powerful way. We miss her terribly.
