Heidelberg Catechism

Q. 122. What is the first petition?

A. Hallowed be thy Name. That is: Grant us first of all that we may rightly know thee,[1] and sanctify, glorify, and praise thee in all thy works, in which shine forth thy almighty power, wisdom, goodness, righteousness, mercy, and truth.[2] Grant us also that we may so direct our whole life— our thoughts, words, and actions—that thy Name is not blasphemed because of us but always honored and praised.[3]
